Tait Electrical Generating Station, LLC, headquartered in Dayton, Ohio, is a 12.6 mile natural gas transmission system. Pipeline system and facilities are located in Jefferson Township and Montgomery County in Dayton, Ohio.

WHAT DOES TAIT ELECTRICAL GENERATING STATION, LLC DO IF A LEAK OCCURS?

To prepare for the event of a leak, pipeline companies regularly communicate, plan and train with local emergency responders. Upon the notification of an incident or leak the pipeline company will immediately dispatch trained personnel to assist emergency responders.

Pipeline operators and emergency responders are trained to protect life, property and facilities in the case of an emergency.

Pipeline operators will also take steps to minimize the amount of product that leaks out and to isolate the pipeline emergency.

MAINTAINING SAFETY AND INTEGRITY OF PIPELINES

Lighter than air and will generally rise and dissipate. May gather in a

confined space and travel to a source of ignition.

Will be easily ignited by heat, sparks or flames and will form explosive mixtures with air.

Vapors may cause dizziness or asphyxiation without warning and may be toxic if inhaled at high concentrations. Contact with gas or liquefied gas may cause burns, severe injury

Tait Electrical Generating Station, LLC invests significant time and capital maintaining the quality and integrity of their pipeline systems. The Tait Electrical Generating Station, LLC natural gas pipeline is monitored 24 hours a day. Tait Electrical Generating Station, LLC utilizes on-ground observers to identify potential dangers.


Changes may occur. Contact the operator to discuss their pipeline systems and areas of operation.

Control center personnel continually monitor the pipeline system and assess changes in pressure and flow. They notify field personnel if there is a possibility of a leak.
